John Marshall Law School



Since 1933 John Marshall Law School in Atlanta Georgia had provided a high quality legal education, but could do so only for students taking the state of Georgia bar exam. In 1987 the Georgia Supreme Court changed the procedures requiring that all Georgia Law Schools obtain ABA accreditation, which of course would expand the reach and value of John Marshall's educational expertise.

As part of this process, the need to have an effective Student Information System became evident. Atlanta's John Marshall Law School turned to EDC Technology as its technology partner. EDC has been in the higher education technology business since 1964, assisting schools with specialized goals and needs. While the needs presented by John Marshall were unique to Law Schools, the ability to satisfactorily meet these challenges was neither a new concept nor process for EDC to accomplish.
